Tour-Mate asked Bill Hayden, Interpretive Specialist at the National Park Service, to tell us more about how the Eco-Boxes are being used at Glacier National Park. Read what he had to say, below!

"We purchased four of the Eco-Boxes to use with some new 'family' exhibits at Logan Pass. Logan Pass is the highest part of the park reached by road and is at an elevation of 6646 ft.

The exhibits highlight different animals found in the sub-alpine environment and talk about each one's particular "super-power" – things like camouflage, stamina, or climbing ability.

One of the messages for each exhibit is an audio description of the panel itself. The second message for each exhibit is a message about climate change and how that affects each species. The climate change message is read by kids, so that they can hear about science from a peer.

We selected the accessible model to make the exhibits available to the widest possible audience. People with visual and hearing limitations can still enjoy the exhibits. Visitors with mobility challenges can also use the Eco-Boxes without assistance."
