O'BANNON STATE PARK

The O'Bannon Woods State Park (formerly Wyandotte Woods State Recreation Area) is located in Corydon Indiana, in the southern part of the state that borders the Ohio River. The park is inside the 26,000-acre Harrison Crawford State Forest.

The Park recently acquired EB100 Eco-boxes. They will be placed on nature trails throughout the park. The tour messages will be in English. Tour-Mate worked with the park to record the scripts.

Jarrett Manek, an O'Bannon State Park Naturalist stated, "The Access to Recreation Initiative, supported by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and the Harrison County Community Foundation, will allow O'Bannon Woods State Park to enhance accessibility and construct a new, one-mile forest resource trail at this southern Indiana site. With grant funds, the state park highlighted special areas of interest along the trail where the Tour-Mate Eco-boxes will help to tell the story about the park and surrounding area. The areas of interest include a frog pond with wildlife viewing blind overlooking food plots, a historic site, sensory gardens, and the 1800 era pioneer farmstead and haypress."

Visitors will be able to experience the various sounds of nature and wildlife that are native to the park, such as elk, bison and timberwolves. The tour will provide visitors with explanations about the park; its habitat, and larger wildlife descriptions.

The Eco-Box is an ecological solution for providing tours in outdoor spaces. It is lead free and was designed to have a minimal carbon footprint on the surrounding environment. To operate it, the visitor turns the crank located on the front of the box and pushes a button to listen to the desired message.

A FIRST FOR THE NAUTILUS

The historic USS NAUTILUS can be found can be found at the Submarine Force Museum, located at Thames River in Groton, Connecticut. The Nautilus was the first nuclear powered submarine in the world.

English, Spanish, Mandarin, and Japanese. The tour provides visitors with details about various areas of the ship including the main hall, torpedo rooms and the attack center.

The EL version of the Listening Wand incorporates a 'talking keypad' which assists visitors with visual disabilities by providing voice prompts of individual key strokes.

This historic craft was sent to sea by President Harry S. Truman at the Electric Boat Shipyard in Groton, Connecticut on June 14, 1952. Now retired from active duty, this historic ship continues to amaze and educate those who board her.
